## FROM THE REGISTRAR'S DESK, YEAR 1972

Dear Alumnus:

We believe our graduates of early years will be interested in school history throughout much of the life of our Association especially those who may have left Shamokin shortly after graduation, seldom if ever to return. Doubtless many others of lesser years, also living elsewhere, may wonder what changes have occurred in school buildings and our city in general. We invite your attention first, to schools.

As of now there are possible 9500 living members of the Alumni Association. We have addresses for approximately 9000. The whereabouts of the remaining 500 are unknown. Heading the list is one graduate of the 1894 class. Records indicate all members of the 1897 class deceased but bulletins are still being mailed to members of all other classes. They live in practically every state including Alaska and Hawaii and in Puerto Rico, South America and in several European, Asiatic and African countries.

Early graduates may have attended the Penrose School or at least recall its existence. It has long been razed and replaced by a new Grant School erected in 1904 at Shamokin and Race Streets. This structure was also demolished several years ago and the vacated space is being used as a city playground. The old Garfield building at Sunbury and Franklin Streets met a similar fate and the site converted into a recreational area. The structure standing on the plot bounded by Arch, Eighth and Grant Streets, originally built to serve as the Shamokin Academy was taken over by public school authorities and used as a public elementary school up to the time it was torn down to permit erection of a High School from which the 1915 class was the first to graduate. The old red brick High adjacent on the south has since been used as a Junior-Senior High and given the name, Academy. The Washington on Sunbury Street, the Lincoln on Market Street and the Stevens at Third and Spruce Streets are still occupied for elementary school purposes. The latter was also erected in 1904, along the same architectural lines as the Grant, already mentioned. In 1954 ground was broken at Lincoln, Seventh and Anthracite Streets (Forsythe property) for another unit which now houses the main administration office, a gymnasium and vocational school. It is here that our annual reunions have been held since 1957. Since the Post Office building at Sunbury and Rock Streets was vacated it has been absorbed by the school system and is being used as secondary administration offices for elementary purposes. Ultimately it will also house offices of the school tax collector.

As the result of merging Shamokin City, Coal, Shamokin and East Cameron Townships in 1965 a sizeable number of Coal Township buildings are being used as element-

ary and Junior High Schools. Several others have been removed or are condemned as unsafe. Yellow buses are everywhere.

Presently a new Vocational School is being erected south and west of the former Edgewood Park. It is approximately 70 per cent completed. Land has also been purchased west of the Park to permit construction of a modern High School to accommodate pupils of the merged areas. In addition, present avenues must be extended to the sites, possibly including a road across the north mountain to Trevorton for utilization by pupils of the Vocational School although Zerbe Township (Trevorton) is not involved in the school merger. Reconstruction of the Annex into class rooms for fifth graders is also part of the building program. We feel rather certain that renovations, new buildings and extras will cost approximately \$18,000,000 and whether originally financed by Federal and State grants and County and local taxes the ultimate bill must be paid in full by the area's citizens. Despite the school merger a consolidation of our Association and that of Coal Township has not been resolved, even though our Maroon and Grey colors have been replaced by the Purple and White of Coal Township.

undergone little change since the turn of the century, a large part has been renovated and developed in practically all directions. Very noticeably are the disappearances of old landmarks of bygone eras. We start with railroads. Just about everyone will recall the Reading double trackage through town and the multiple passenger service between Philadelphia and Williamsport daily. Also the large station, freight house and adjacent switching yards. There is nothing left of that complex except a single track through town used for freight only. The entire vacated area between Washington and Rock Streets and between Independence Street and the Penn Central track on Commerce Streets has been transformed into a City parking lot. The remaining space west of Washington Street (former freight yard tracks) is now the site of the Post Office built in 1966.

The Penn Central (former Pennsy) still has single trackage through town but like the Reading has provided no passenger service for many years. Nor are there any early morning miners' trains to collieries at Mt. Carmel and intermediate points because all former deep mines and breakers have been abandoned. One return freight trip between Sunbury and Mt. Carmel five days a week constitutes its entire traffic. Recently the trustees of the bankrupt company have applied to I.C.C. for permission to abandon all services on this spur line. While the passenger station and express buildings still

stand they are being used for storage purposes by private concerns. The old freight house and engine house at Sixth and Walnut Streets have also been wiped off. A Weis supermarket and parking lot now occupies that area. We have hinted about collieries but will now dwell on that subject a trifle longer. The only old time deep mine and breaker remaining in the area is the rebuilt Glen Burn (Cameron) with only a small percentage of its raw product being extracted from a few underground sections. Its principal source of supply comes from rapidly decreasing stripings and small mines owned and operated by individuals. The Glen Burn also attracts thousands of visitors during the summer months as a well established tourist center. Stripings and independent mines also furnish raw material to a limited number of small preparation plants in the immediate area. The original silk mill and dye house of J. H. and C. K. Eagle was located on West Arch Street but in time outgrew its capacity and moved into new buildings on Franklin Street south of the Pennsy railroad. After many years of operation there the bottom dropped out of its market. They were then taken over by Shamokin Realty Corporation which leased portions to Arrow Shirt Co., several shoe manufacturing concerns, etc. and for a number of years as a munitions depot of the Armed Forces. The old Eagle silk mill complex on West Arch was replaced by Coal Township as an athletic field but while now virtually abandoned as such, is still intact. Possibly the greatest change involves Edgewood Park. Except for an unusable lake and deserted bath house every vestige of the amusement center is gone. One could not even determine the location of Rebecca Spring with a divining rod.

A modern illuminated and well bleachered athletic stadium supplants the old time baseball and football field to the south and west of the Park, and adjacent to that is a practice field. North of the Park stands the beautiful Lady of Lourdes Parochial School. The remaining and greater portion of the Park has been developed as a residential area of homes of varied and modern design through which Stetler Drive courses as a western extension of Park Avenue. Just a bit of advice—don't wait on a street car—**THERE AIN'T ANY**.

In the city proper, a ten-story High Rise apartment complex for needy and aged citizens of the area was constructed on the former McConnel home site bounded by Sunbury, Orange and Dewart Streets. A community pool and bath house occupy an area west of Rock Street to Shamokin Creek and extends northward from Race Street to a point within 40 yards of Spurzheim. To accommodate this development many residences and a few commercial buildings had to be demolished. A

 colony of medium priced two-family units at moderate rentals is under construction south of Shamokin Cemetery (Raspberry Hill). A new public playground on Bunker Hill named after Glenn Parks, a boy who drowned, is also nearing completion.

Work on a new County Hospital along the Trevorton Road is progressing rapidly. Originally referred to as the Poor House the new structure is a much needed facility as the present units are crammed with needy and indigent guests.

An enterprise to be known as the J. H. Vastine Foundation is soliciting funds for a Cardiac Center addition to Shamokin State General Hospital. It will be a memorial to one of Shamokin's former devoted physicians who served our community for many years.

Approximately one mile east of Shamokin, Anthra-Plaza accommodates many various businesses found in shopping centers. It is here too that Route 61 was materially changed with side roads leading to Coal Run, Brady, Excelsior and Locust Gap.

Industrial Park lying between Paxinos and Elysburg accommodates a huge building of the Arrow Shirt Co., used as a distribution center;

Doll Paper Co. and the Wickes Corp., builders of trailers and modular homes. However, rumors are rife that the latter will shortly cease manufacturing and transfer its activities to other numerous plants in nearby and distant areas.

Under contemplation is construction of an eastbound highway, Route 61, on Commerce Street if Penn Central abandons its trackage, the westbound traffic to continue over Sunbury Street and auxiliary streets after elimination of curves at a few points, and also widening of Market Street between Sunbury and Commerce Streets (Route 125) as well as a filtering plant along Shamokin Creek at a site to be determined but believed to be a short distance beyond Weigh Scales.

Approval by the Housing and Urban development of a renewal and grant application for slightly over \$4,000,000 by the Shamokin Redevelopment Authority was recently announced. The project will be confined to the Bunker Hill Section north of Commerce Street and the business district, and will include land acquisition, relocation of site occupants, clearance and preparation, additional recreation areas, street and utility improvements and provisions for low and moderate income housing.

Throughout various parts of the city faces of business establishments have taken on a new look. Recently additions have been completed to

some and new buildings have replaced old junky ones, most prominent of which is the Central Pennsylvania Savings Association, formerly the West Ward Building and Loan, located on South Market St. The new building stands at 100 W. Independence St. and the structure and patron's parking lot extend eastward from Market to Diamond Street. The city can also boast of six banks, including one branch. The interior of all but one have been modernized and enlarged with drive-in features and depositors' parking lots added. Combined assets of all banks and savings and loan associations in Shamokin run into high millions.

During Holy Week in 1971 a disastrous fire completely destroyed the high spire, roof and interior of St. Edward's Catholic Church on Shamokin Street. Only thick walls composed of huge blocks of stone remained virtually intact. It was Shamokin's oldest and most impressive landmark and the first church in America to be illuminated by electric light. Although considerable work remains to be done to complete the interior, progress toward that end has been steady.

That winds up our story for the 1972 edition of the Alumni Bulletin. We urge you to return once in a while to take a gander at the old town and also check on the accuracy of this account.
